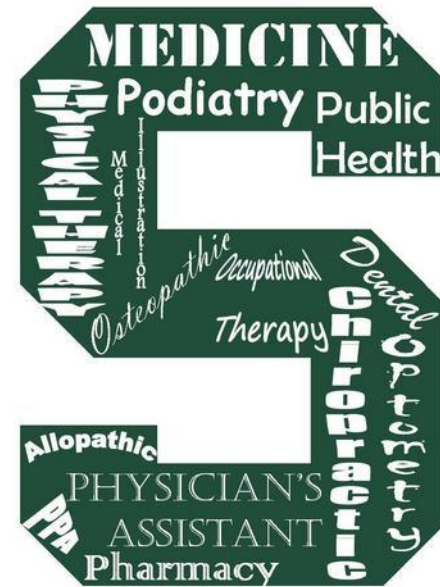

Challenges & Opportunities

- *100,000 Strong* Launched in 2011
- Mobility of 100,000 students in both directions by 2020 is ambitious—nearly doubles current numbers in less than 10 years.
- Better prepare a globally aware and culturally competent workforce
- Expand study abroad opportunities
- Enhance economic competitiveness
- Increase prosperity
- Strengthen bi-national relations



Innovation Fund

- Established as a public-private partnership between the U.S. Department of State, Partners of the Americas, and NAFSA: Association of International Educators.
- Awards promote transnational partnerships by leveraging private sector contributions and commitments by higher education institutions to increase unique study abroad opportunities.



Innovation Fund

- To date, 48 Innovation Fund grants have been awarded to teams of 110 higher education institutions from 16 countries in the Western Hemisphere region.
- Winners of the last round supported by Servicio Nacional de Aprendizaje (SENA) to collaborate with U.S. community colleges and SENA Centers in Colombia that promote study abroad or exchange in Innovation, Research, Differentiation, and Languages will be announced next week.
